SAN FRANCISCO, Calif. (18 October 2009) – San Francisco's **African-American Shakespeare Company** announced today the appointment of **L. Peter Callender** as Artistic Director. Callender has worked professionally as an actor, writer, and director for over 30 years. He received his formal training in theater at the Juilliard School in New York City, and has appeared on Broadway, off-Broadway, and in regional theaters across the United States and abroad. An associate artist at California Shakespeare Theater, Callender's Bay Area and regional credits include roles at Berkeley Repertory Theater, Aurora Theatre Company, American Conservatory Theater, Lorraine Hansberry Theater, Magic Theater, Cincinnati Playhouse, and Arena Stage, among others. Callender officially begins his duties as African-American Shakespeare Company's Artistic Director in May 2010.
